

RIISS00033 | UNDERGROUND COAL MINE SAFETY SKILLSET (Standard 11)

Course Overview

This skillset provides the essential safety knowledge and skills required for individuals working in an underground coal mine environment. It is a mandatory requirement for workers entering the Queensland underground coal mining industry, covering hazard identification, risk management, emergency response, self-escape techniques, and site safety procedures.

Course Duration – 2 Days

1 Day online training

1 Day in person assessment

Units of Competency

- RIICOM201E Communicate in the workplace
- RIIERR203E Escape from hazardous situations unaided
- RIIERR205D Apply initial response First Aid
- RIIGOV201E Comply with site work processes/procedures
- RIIRIS201E Conduct local risk control
- RIIWHS201E Work safely and follow WHS policies and procedures
- RIICOM201E Communicate in the workplace

Cost

\$850 – full course

\$600 – refresher course

Assessment - 1 day

Learners cannot attempt their theory and practical assessment for the course until training has successfully been completed. Should re-assessment be required the fee is \$450.00 payable before the attempt at assessment is conducted.

Course Validity and Refreshers

The refresher period for the mining unit(s) is five years, a shorter period may be required where industry/company requirements are applicable. Individuals can refresh their competencies anytime within the five-year period in line with these industry/company-specific requirements.

This course is a requirement of the Coal Mining Safety and Health Act 1999 Division 2 Section 56 and of the Mining and Quarrying Safety and Health Act 1999 Division 2 section 51.

Pre-Requisites

Nil.

Pathways

Successful completion of this skill set provides a pathway to further qualifications within the RII Training Package, such as the Certificate III in Underground Coal Operations or Certificate IV in Underground Coal Mining Supervision. It can also contribute to competency for specialised roles in underground mine safety, emergency response teams (ERT), and mining operations management.

Outcome

Upon successful completion of the course the student will be issued a Statement of Attainment under the Australian Qualifications Framework, this certification is nationally recognised.

RPL/RCC

In some cases, students may possess skills and or knowledge in the course content. CCT will assess your eligibility for RPL/RCC. Information on RPL/RCC can be found in the CCT student handbook, on our website or by contacting our office.

Entry Requirements

CCT policy requires students to be a minimum of 18 years of age and have at least a Year 10 level of numeracy, literacy and communication skills prior to enrolling and attending this course.

Resources Required

Students are required to wear appropriate clothing including high visibility long sleeve shirt, long pants, work boots, and hard hat during training. Machinery and equipment are supplied when training at our facility. All written material and stationery are supplied for the course. Students must provide their own food; fridges are available onsite. Tea and coffee are supplied by CCT.
